

HRE130 Religion Exam-June 7, 2019

Semester 2 Exam Review Sheet

The exam covers chapter 27-64 of “the Ministry of Christ” (with most of the exam focusing on ch. 27-56)

Before your exam:

1. Review all your notes, review sheets, and tests
2. Study regularly in short, focused sessions (approximately 30 minutes at a time). This is much more effective than studying for long stretches the night or two before the exam.
3. Re-read all of the Bible passages we have studied, and review the notes associated with them. Strive for understanding.
4. Make a list of all the people we have encountered in our study, both those with names (eg. Nicodemus) and without names (eg. Samaritan woman). For each person, list several of the most important facts and/or incidents related to them. Also list any important quotes from them.
5. For each lesson, determine what you think are the most important contents, and make sure you understand them. You may want to highlight, re-write, or summarize each of them.
6. I will not ask you minor details, such as:
 - When was the feast of trumpets celebrated?
 - Who reigned over Judea from 25-36 AD?
7. Few exam questions will be exact copies of test questions, so while reviewing tests may be somewhat helpful, don't spend too much time on them

Exam Format:

Multiple Choice: (~5-10 marks)

Quotes: Identify who said the quote and what the quote means. (~10 marks)

Point Form Answer (~20 marks)

Longer Answer: answer in sentence form (~25 marks)

Essay: Summarize ch. 27-64 with 3-5 words/short phrases and explain each one using Biblical examples, Biblical references, and personal applications. (14 marks)

Here are some suggestions for how to organize your ch. 27-64 essay (you may use one of these outlines or you may develop your own). If you have another way to organize your essay and you are not sure if it is acceptable, please talk to me.

Teaching (parables, end times)
Compassion (disciples, miracles)
Humble (washing feet, donkey)

Be Ready
Hypocrites/Warnings
Preparation
Reactions
Training/Testing

Offense of Jesus' Ministry
Claims of Jesus' Ministry
Climax of Jesus' Ministry

You could also create a phrase and use each word for a section of your essay. For example, "Christ's earthly ministry" (Christ's suffering, teaching, and glory).

During your exam, you should:

1. Read over the entire exam before you start. Often questions are answered in different parts of the exam.
2. View the exam as part of your learning experience. Often the focused intensity of writing an exam will help you learn new things while you are writing the exam.
3. Budget your time carefully. For example, don't spend so much time on short answer that you have no time left for the essay.
4. Pay attention to how much each question is worth. If a question is worth 4 marks, provide at least 4 distinct ideas in your answer.
5. Pay attention to how many questions you need to answer. If you are asked to answer 5 out of 7 questions, only answer 5 questions!
